Tempe Transit

The transit provider for the City of Tempe, AZ, and the surrounding area, Tempe operates more than 100 natural gas powered buses. LNG proved the best solution for accommodating Tempe's longer routes and heavier fuel consumption. Clean Energy designed, built and operates Tempe's LNG fueling facility, complete with two 11,000 gallon storage tanks. Tempe is currently consuming more than 200,000 gallons per month.

Foothill Transit

Servicing the San Gabriel and Pomona Valleys of Southern California, Foothill Transit represents another innovative leader in cleaner transit alternatives. Foothill is also the 2nd largest municipal transit operator in LA County. In 2001, Clean Energy won a competitive contract, becoming the natural gas fuel provider for Foothill following its decision to purchase 170 natural gas buses. Clean Energy was entrusted with the design, construction and maintenance of a state-of-the-art CNG fueling station with a capacity exceeding 2,100 gallons per hour. The station was completed in 2002. The fueling station will serve as the backbone of Foothill Transit's CNG fleet for years to come. The success of this project led to a second award to Clean Energy to build another CNG station at

Foothill's Irwindale bus yard. This station was commissioned in June 2005 and will serve a growing fleet of CNG buses over a 10-year agreement.



San Diego Transit System

In June 2002, Clean Energy and the Metropolitan Transit Development



Board (MTDB) entered into a long-term contract for Clean Energy to become the MTDB's CNG fuel supplier for three transit facilities in the San Diego metropolitan area. These stations, owned by the MTDB, dispense nearly 5 million gallons per year of CNG, fueling over 500 transit buses. The MTDB has entrusted to Clean Energy all maintenance and operational duties for these stations. Additionally, Clean Energy acts as a natural gas commodity consultant and broker for the MTDB, providing information on current and projected natural gas market trends, advice on "locking in" commodity price, and capital to purchase forward contracts.

Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority

In 2003, Clean Energy begins fueling the natural gas fleet of buses serving the Boston area, the oldest and 4th largest transportation system in the U.S.
